People with disabilities often face challenges that require specialized assistance. By referring individuals to CMAs that specialize in disability support and helping people access long-term care services, we can contribute to promoting a holistic approach to well-being, fostering independence, and enhancing overall quality of life.

How it Works

Individuals are assigned to a CMA based on their county of residence. This includes children and adults with disabilities (qualifying diagnoses) spanning:

- Intellectual and developmental disabilities/delays (I/DD)
- Physical
- Aging
- Mental health
- Medical

Partnering with Trusted Agencies

Case Management Agencies offer individuals and families support accessing the long-term care system through state and federally-funded programs like Medicaid Waivers. This is done through "Case Management," a collaborative process that includes intake, eligibility, program enrollment, active case management and service coordination, assessment, service planning, monitoring, referral, education, advocacy, and outreach.
